- Designing stock decision procedures
- Safety stock levels and reorder points
- Min/Max system application and improvement
- Forecasting material needs and cataloging



- Building Bills of Materials (BOM) for effective parts control

Day 4: Effective Inventory Planning and Control

- Setting strategic inventory objectives
- Rationalizing inventory and cost control
- Economic Order Quantity (EOQ) calculations
- Pareto analysis and cost-focused planning
- Improving material coding, accuracy, and cycle counting
- Best practices in physical inventory control

Day 5: Tactical and Operational Approaches in Transportation Economics

- Strategic transportation planning in logistics
- Modes of transport and intermodal system review
- Application of INCOTERMS and liability management
- Managing hazardous materials transportation
- Cost-efficiency and optimization in logistics operations
